Bradbury intentionally made the characters childlike and naive, and the writing had the same feel. I want to think this was on purpose, but it was probably more because it was easy. Why is it in great novels where the world has become a giant conspiracy that there is always only one or two random, seemingly normal people that figure it out. "1984" and "Brave New World" also do this and it drives me nuts. There's no real reason why it all of a sudden dawned on the character that the world that has been presented to them is

flawed. Why is it only one person ever realizes it, and for no real apparent reason. They just wake up and say "wait a minute...". I also wish these books went 1. more into the reasons why the society got to the way it is and 2. more into how the character reconciles the truth of the situation and carries on for a better world.
