When I first looked through this book and read it I was not happy, though not disappointed in the artwork. The artwork is mostly of Jane Eyre, and none of the artwork really captured her features and personality at all. This cast a darkned element over the book and almost "forced" a victorian viewpoint of this story. I think the artwork of other versions are much better by comparrison.
