There have been valid comparisons to Poe, Kafka, and Thomas Hardy, but the presence of her trademark themes, cleverly juxtaposed and set in her risk-taking prose, mark The Parson as 100% Kavan.

I'm sure there are plenty of other things he has written in the third person that the reader can easily transfer into the first person (applying to Dr. Janov himself). Doing this exercise will go a long way towards turning some of the more disturbing sentences he says into innocuous and funny ones (Well, at least for me it does).
