Another theme to ignore if you want a decent guy in your life is the idea that you'd better just clam up when you're angry --to teach him a lesson. There is a term for this, it's called passive-aggressive behavior,

and it's a psychological problem that couples go to therapy to try to STOP doing. The author wrote this book for profit, which often requires sensationalism, and against that I have no complaint. However, I was too embarrassed to have this title staring me down from my iPad every time I opened the Kindle app, so I deleted it from my account. If you MUST read advice on relationships rather than talking to your loved one, just use the internet. At least you won't have to pay for it (although figuratively, you might).
